The Version 2 Accreditation Canada (formerly CCHSA) standards published in May 2008 now include reference to libraries. Libraries can contact their Accreditation Coordinator for access to the standards which are only available on the organizational portal. Version 3 will be released sometime in 2009. CHLA/ABSC will continue to work to promote libraries with Accreditation Canada. Not all the changes recommended by CHLA/ABSC in their letter to Accreditation Canada have been incorporated.
