 - Closing balance is \$5,316.53 as of November 17
 - Membership Report Jeff Mason
 - 40 total members, 39 individuals and 1 student. Increase of 1 member from 2023.
 - Jeff poses question of whether numbers will be sustained when membership dues are reinstated
 - Membership drive 10 new members. Four current members qualified for referral prize, Erin Stienstra and Sarah Visintini were the winners this year.

 - Investigating Wordpress update and features to decide whether to migrate OVHLA site to new version.
 - CE Coordinator's Report Danielle MacDougall
 - OVHLA Mini-symposium was held May 9th
 - 4 presentations, 17 attendees
 - Feedback survey results show continued support for holding the event virtually
 - 2024 Professional Development Grant was awarded to Melissa Severn, who is participating in the MLA CE Passport program and will provide an overview of her experience at a later date

8.0 Updated <u>Constitution and By-Laws</u>

- First full review in ~5 years. Borrowed language and ideas from other regional chapters and CHLA by-laws
- Special thanks to the committee (Robyn Hocking, Eva-Marie Neumann, and Sandra McKeown) for their work on this project.
- Renee highlighted specific changes:
 - Removed outdated references to Ontario Health Libraries Association
 - Clarified purpose and membership criteria
 - Membership open to all persons located in the Ottawa River Valley and adjoining regions without limitations and at the discretion of the executive
 - Added clauses around membership termination
 - Added additional information on executive positions
 - Added greater clarity under elections and meetings, including 14 day notification period for general meetings and adjustment of quorum (8 members representing 3 different institutions, or 25% of members in good standing, whichever is lesser)
 - Call for review of bylaws every 5 years
 - Membership year set to January December 31st
 - Dissolution clause if association were dissolved, any debts are to be paid and all assets remaining must be transferred to CHLA
